Employees are able to access 1 free treatment per month to unwind and experience all that we have to offer our clients, because why should they get to have all the fun right!

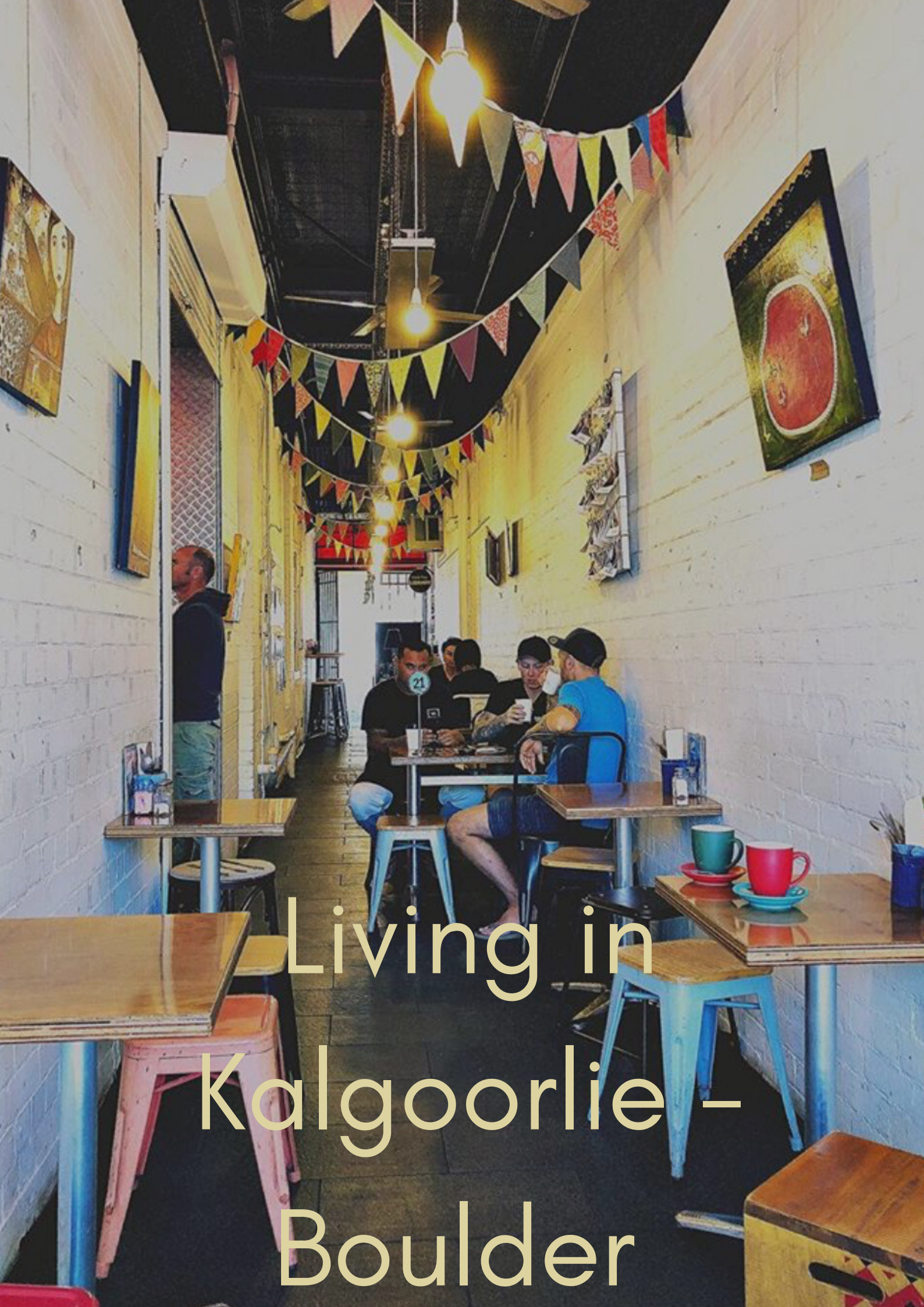

Home to over 30,000 residents, Kalgoorlie-Boulder is everything you'd expect a modern regional centre to be. Whether you enjoy being close to nature or maybe sipping a latte in the CBD is more your idea of heaven, Kalgoorlie has something for everyone.

The primary industry of Kalgoorlie-Boulder is mining and you may know of Kalgoorlie as being the home of the Superpit, supporting the mining companies are hundreds of locally owned businesses such as mechanical workshops, industrial retail, earthmoving, plant hire, heavy fabrication, electrical contractors and then of course feeding into that are the industries and careers that keep the town ticking; government, childcare, hospitality, retail, education and this one, Goldfields Revitalise.

Kalgoorlie is quite unique in that our town centre is quite cosmopolitan with numerous restaurants, cafe's and high street retail, yet, a 20 minute drive from the CBD finds you out bush and amongst nature.

Our Region & History

At the turn of the century the Goldfields was home to a number of bustling mining towns.

With most now nothing more than a cemetery and a few relics, they can be explored in a day trip, or, take the weekend and head north to the historic townsite of Kookynie and Lake Ballard, home to the famous art installation by Antony Gormley

Both the Kalgoorlie and Boulder main streets are home to stunning 1890's goldrush architecture. The WA Museum of the Goldfields is situated at the top of Hannan Street, spend your weekends exploring the Goldfields history or one of the many visiting exhibitions.

The opportunities to immerse yourself in our landscape, history and heritage are endless.

The Surrounding Area

With Perth a short 1 hour flight away and a direct flight to Melbourne once a week, catching up with family and friends (or going to the footy at the G) can fit easily into a weekend.

Missing the beach? Australia's best beaches are located a 4 hour drive south in Esperance. From the more "tourist" beaches at Twilight Cove & Lucky Bay to the more secluded Alexander Bay to the east, discover why Esperance is a "must see" on every travellers list and a perennial favourite of Goldfielders.

King of the West

Located approx 27 kilometres north of Kalgoorlie the King of the West is a favourite among water sport enthusiasts.

Niagara Dam / Kookynie region

Kookynie is located 190km north of Kalgoorlie-Boulder along the Goldfields Highway, the tiny town was once a major mining centre, boasting a population of more than 3,500, the region's first public swimming pool, 11 hotels and regular train services from Kalgoorlie.

However, it has now gone the way of many early goldrush towns and at last count had a population of 10! Plus 1 resident pub horse.

Niagara Dam is located a 20 mins drive from the pub and with no light pollution for 100's of kilometres nothing beats rolling out the swag and stargazing

The Golden Quest Discovery Trail

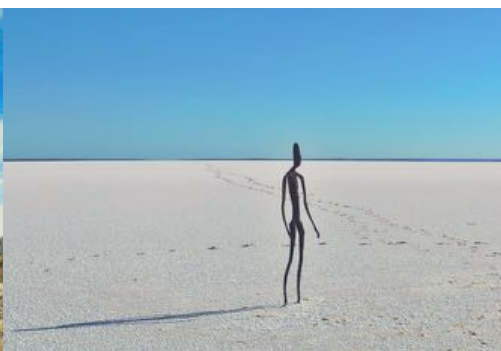
This self-drive adventure trail takes you to 25 official sites, or stopping points that include must-stop-and-see places such as Lake Ballard, Gwalia, Historical Outback Pubs, Rowles Lagoon Conservation Park and The Terraces.

Some destinations can be seen in a day, others are more suited to a long weekend, all offer an experience you can't find elsewhere.

Coolgardie

Coolgardie has some of the grandest surviving goldrush-era historical buildings and collections which include the Goldfields Exhibition Museum, Post Office Complex, Pharmaceutical Museum and Warden Finnerty's Residence

Retail & Eating Out

Serviced by the big nationals such as Target, Kmart, Woolworths & Coles and joined by IGA's, high street stores, local independent retailers and award winning beauty & hair salons theres always the opportunity to indulge in a bit of retail therapy.

From the Hannans Boulevard situated in the northern suburbs to the Target, Woolies and Kmart complexes in the CBD, and arts centric shops in Burt St, there is a little bit of something for everyone.

Kalgoorlie-Boulder is home to a thriving arts and makers scene, from permanent shops to pop-up markets our talented locals are prominent within our community.

Take a stroll down Hannan Street stopping in St Barbara's Square to sit & soak up the sun while enjoying a coffee from a nearby cafe.

The Lord Forrest Precint adjacent to the Goldfields Art Centre is a fantastic place to claim a shady spot on the lawn for your lunch break, or watch the kids shred at the skate park

In April 2018 it was announced the CBD will be given a major refurbishment with increased streetscaping, designated pedestrian malls, increased community events and entertainment.

A quiet drink listening to live music in Judds beer garden or downing a famous Broady Burger at the Broad Arrow Tavern.

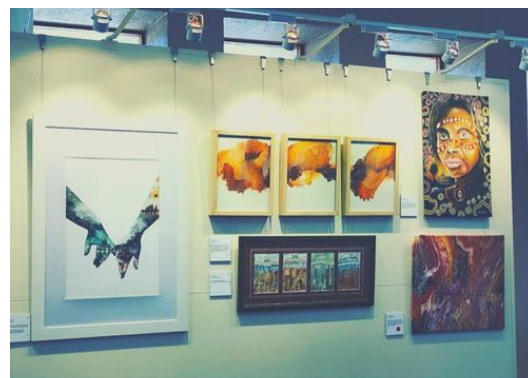
Visiting Kalgoorlie's local micro brewery - Beaten Track, with its chilled out atmosphere and tasty pizzas is a great alternative to the pub scene.

Arts & Culture

In recent years Kalgoorlie has seen an explosion in the local makers & artists scene.

The Heartwalk street art project has brought a new look to the city's buildings, art trails, the annual Art Prize, markets, theatre groups, Goldfields Art Centre and the WA Museum are just a few of the experiences on offer to enrich your soul

Located in the Lord Forrest Precinct adjacent to the CBD the Goldfields Arts Centre is the only multi-functional arts venue in the Goldfields region. It boasts a 700 seat auditorium, multiple gallery spaces including a dedicated A-Class gallery, an ensemble room, function room, meeting rooms and dance studio. The GAC presents an annual program that seeks to provide unique cultural experiences and opportunities for the community.

The City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder Art Prize is a popular and esteemed regional art competition that attracts artists from all across Australia. It is a long-standing annual event that has become an important occasion in the Western Australian arts calendar.



Parks, Playgrounds & Leisure

From the streetscaping in the city centre to the multitude of suburban playgrounds you'd be forgiven for believing that you weren't on the edge of the desert.

The Goldfields Oasis and adjoining playing fields are home to the majority of team based sports as well as an indoor pool complex & gym.

The newly constructed Ray Finlayson complex is home to soccer, cricket and the 20/20 season.

Linked by a series of bike paths weekends can be spent on lazy bike rides, or jump in the 4WD and headout to one of the numerous dams & camp sites surrounding the town.

The family will love Hammond Park with its lush green lawns and gardens, BBQ's, play equipment and animals such as birds, peacocks, emu's and kangaroos

Sport

The Goldfields has a rich sporting history, home to a multitude of sports and state of the art complexes.

AFL, soccer, touch, squash, cricket, tennis, tri's, cycling, swimming, t-ball, motorsport, moto x, park runs, golf, water polo, pony club, BMX, horse racing, netball & basketball are all well represented.

AFL

The Goldfields Football League has been in operation for over 120 years, with 5 teams across 3 grades as well as representation at State based competitions the local league is highly competitive.

We are proud sponsors of the Kalgoorlie football club and you may just see Tanya & Eshe wearing a jumper for the Womens League.

Motorsports

Kalgoorlie International Speedway is known as one of the premier speedway venues in Western Australia. The race season runs from spring through to autumn and attracts Australian and state titles.



Moto X and Bike Enthusiasts

The Goldfields Motorcycle Club conducts regular meets at the Ken Marshall Track in West Kalgoorlie. Events are run throughout the year in junior and senior divisions.

The Kalgoorlie Desert Race joined the Kalgoorlie-Boulder regions events calendar in 2017. The race brings together participants from both the motorcycling and four-wheeled off road racing world. Kalgoorlie's red sandy tracks and loamy bush offers competitors the perfect terrain, while the close proximity of the course to the Kalgoorlie town centre allows easy access for both local and non-local spectators.

Golf

The Kalgoorlie Golf Course is a premier, 18 hole grass golf course designed by top course designer Graham Marsh. Currently ranked #18 in Australia's top 100 Public access courses the course is open to the general public.

Triathlon

The club caters for all triathlon distances from enticer, short-course long course and Duathlon. Triathlons are held in and around the Goldfields, including Kalgoorlie-Boulder, Coolgardie, Kambalda and Norseman. The annual Women's Tri is a very popular event, and several Junior Tri events are held each season.

Gyms & Fitness

The gym junkies in our community are well catered for with 5 fully equipped gyms plus crossfit, F45, access to private PT's, martial arts, yoga and pilates. We offer aerial yoga and local personal trainers can access our facilities to provide services to their clients. These services are offered as part of our vision for a Holistic Health Hub.

Schools & Higher Education

Very much a family town, the city of Kalgoorlie-Boulder is home to a number of state & private schools.

State primary schools are located in the suburbs of Hannans, North Kalgoorlie (Lamington), Central Kalgoorlie, O'Connor, East Kalgoorlie, South Kalgoorlie and Boulder. In addition we are home to 2 catholic primary schools and 1 Baptist College.

Upper school students are well serviced by a state high school with a separate senior campus for year 11 & 12. Both campus' are new and offer a number of ATAR & vocational subjects. John Paul College & the Baptist College offer private secondary education through to year 12, both the state and private high schools are support by the Central Regional TAFE in it's vocational courses for VET students.

Curtin University operates the WA School of Mines (WASM) in the city centre, a world class facility, WASM delivers mining based degrees as well as those in health science, commerce and education

Housing

Housing in Kalgoorlie is a wonderful mix of heritage and modern (& the decades in between). From the traditional old Goldfielder's of Lamington, miners cottages of Boulder to the modern brick homes in the newer suburbs of O'Connor, Hannans & Broadwood you are sure to find something to suit your needs & style.



Community Facilities

The Goldfields Oasis provides year round recreation opportunities and is the focal point for the sporting, recreation and leisure pursuits for the community.

Facilities include courts for indoor sports, a 50m heated swimming pool, leisure pool, spa and sauna, swimming lessons, water slides, state of the art health club, group fitness classes, a crèche, function rooms, kiosk and outdoor netball courts and playing fields.

The William Grundt Memorial Library is a meeting place for all residents and visitors that is welcoming, open 7 days per week the Library is located within the C.Y O'Connor Precinct.

The Goldfields Arts Centre is the only multi-functional arts venue in the Goldfields region. It boasts a 700 seat auditorium, multiple gallery spaces including a dedicated A-Class gallery, an ensemble room, function room, meeting rooms and dance studio.

Hammond Park is the jewel of the City's parks and reserves and is home to a range of native animals and features children's play equipment and BBQ facilities. With ponds and aviaries, it's a haven for a variety of birdlife including peacocks, and features a miniature Bavarian Castle built entirely of local gemstones. Bring along a picnic or enjoy light refreshments from the Cafe.

Kingsbury Park is the Kalgoorlie CBD's primary recreational space. Home to Kalgoorlie-Boulder's only skate park, Kingsbury Park hosts many of the City's youth events and activities. Along with the skate park, Kingsbury Park provides play equipment, soccer, rugby and AFL goalposts, BBQ facilities and a basketball court.

Rotary Peace Park, also known as Twin Dams, is ideal for active people as it features a basketball court and outdoor gym equipment. It's also great for families with children's play equipment, shelters, picnic benches, BBQ facilities, toilets and a rotunda.

Centennial Park has a large grassed area with a shaded children's play equipment that is used by a large number of families. The park is equipped with a soundshell which is used throughout the year for various large events such as Australia Day Celebrations, Sunset at the Soundshell, Carols by Candlelight, Christmas in the Park and a number of school concerts.

Karlkurla Bushland Park is a nature reserve for locals and visitors who enjoy bushwalking and observing the native flora and fauna. This 200 hectare natural bushland comprises four kilometres of walking trails, interpretive flora signage and a variety of native plant species.
